KDCOP is a part of an non-profit umbrella organization called Towson Area Citizens On Patrol (TACOP) ... an organization made up of 18 Towson Communities with active Citizens On Patrol Programs

As in every volunteer activity, the number of volunteers fluctuates.
We have offered excellent coverage over the years.

To participate in the KDCOP team of volunteers, it is required that you understand the purpose of COP and realize that you are a volunteer and that none of the above organizations or the County of Baltimore will be responsible if there is a mishap while you are on patrol. Minimum age:21.

The purpose of COP is to partner with the Baltimore County Police to help deter crime and keep peace in our Towson communities. The fact is, by having the COP patrols with signage, the residents have a sense of peace and protection. Another fact is, COP gives the volunteers the opportunity to give back to their community.

Here is how you can help with COP: 1) Automobile Driver, 2) Walker, or 3) Biker. Sign up and we will train you so you can do the patrols when you want. KDCOP is not rigid with a schedule. Go when it is convenient and report back to Pat France via email or phone.

The equipment used when patrolling: 1) magnetic signs that identify your vehicle as a CITIZENS ON PATROL Vehicle; 2) your cell phone; 3) a yellow revolving light for the top of your car. If you are walking or biking, wear a COP T-Shirt.

After you patrol: Email or phone Pat France (patfrance@centrol-inc.com or 410-828-5564).

If You See Something Suspicious, Call The Police! If it is a crime in action or an emergency, dial 911. NEVER STOP AND GET INVOLVED. If Not An Emergency, call the Non-Emergency number for Baltimore County Police 410-887-2222. Identify yourself as Knollwood Donnybrook Citizens On Patrol and then answer the questions the operator will ask.

When patrolling in your car **using your flashing hazard lights**, travel about 20 MPH and use the flashing yellow light on top of your car along with the magnetic signs on the sides and back. Be friendly (wave) and helpful to all our neighbors. *We have had very few incidents in our communities, and with your help, we can keep it that way!*

We are flexible! Go on patrol when you can. And always remember, everybody is a Citizen On Patrol ALL THE TIME. When coming in or going out of the community, keep your eyes peeled! AND Keep your cell phone charged!

We are proud to support the Baltimore County Police, known as one of the best Police Departments in the country!!!! And we are pleased to be the eyes and ears of the police and give back to our communities.
